Looking back at my notes from his first start, which was back in January against tougher maidens, I noted that he looked like a horse that would prefer the turf, and he also has the breeding to back that up. In that race, there was an incident in the stretch, thus the short comment, "cautious handling late." I think he'll appreciate the return to grass.
