BEST BET: Race 8 - #3 Starship Reina

She'll be a very short price, but this mare really does appear to tower over the rest of the field. Seven furlongs is not her most proficient distance, but she does have a win and two second place finishes from five starts at the 7 furlongs. She is coming off a big win last time out, and has plenty of back class for trainer Jorge Navarro.

LONGSHOT: Race 11 - #5 Dah Philly

I know that this filly broke her maiden on the main track, but it was solid effort from her on the turf last time out. While she finished fourth behind a couple others in this field, she was keyed at the start of the race and had to steady multiple times. Trainer Michael Matz opts to keep her on the turf, and reaches out to leading rider Luis Saez, which is always notable. She also is the type that does her best running late, and should have some speed to run at in here.
