Irad Ortiz Jr. has done very well since moving his tack to South Florida, and will certainly have a good grasp of the pace scenario. Ready for Summer's last race at Aqueduct was very strong, and was flattered when the horse that beat her by just half a length came back to win again.

LONGSHOT: Race 4 - #5 Magic Spell

This filly by Majestic Perfection is trying the turf for the first time, but should take to the new surface based on a variety of factors. She has some turf breeding, as two out of her three siblings won on the grass, and her most recent work on the Payson Park turf course was very sharp, and the fastest of 21 workers that day. In addition, she has a race at Gulfstream under belt since shipping down from Woodbine, even though it was on a sealed sloppy track. Should be a square price.
