A Tale of 2nd-time Starters: Race 8 Saturday not only begins the (popular 50-cent) late Pick 5, it also showcases one of the card's most intriguing matchups and puzzles. There's certainly a pretty good mix of runners in this two-year-old Florida-bred maiden special weight. So, here is a rundown of the 8th's biggest players, beginning with a pair of very key second-time starters.

Jettin Out – He's kind of a double-edge sword in that he's winless in three starts (as the most experienced member of the field and a two-time beaten favorite I might add) but he's run the best races against the toughest competition. A sluggish / awkward break preceded a slight steady in his last race but he ran big in defeat anyway while losing to a "got-first-run" Gangly. I'll give Jettin Out one more chance here Saturday for trainer Larry Rivelli.

Parlay Pete – This Cajun Breeze colt has big speed and ran well enough at a demanding seven-furlong trip (his career debut proved an off-the-turf race late last month) and he's the first horse back from that July 27th nightcap. Also, note the switch to leading apprentice Cristian Torres here Saturday for trainer Michael Yates.

Allegedly Perfect – By Kantharos, this Kathleen O'Connell-trained colt hails from a 16-year-old unraced Forest Wildcat dam in Perfectly Wild. Perfectly Wild has been nearly perfect in the breeding shed with seven winning foals from eight to race. Jockey Jairo Rendon pilots from post 5.

Capitan Fofu – Trainer Antonio Sano saddles this Khozan firster with top-jock Emisael Jaramillo. He is related to seven winning siblings and originally breezed a furlong at OBS June in 10 3/5 seconds.
