Saturday Guarantees: Big-money guarantees and two major graded stakes highlight Saturday's 12-race offering at Gulfstream Park. Check out these hot-off-the-press guarantees: the late Pick 5 has a guaranteed pool of \$400,000. The late Pick 4 is guaranteed at \$300,000. Finally, the Rainbow 6 will feature a \$750,000 guarantee – as long as no single jackpot winner takes down the pool on Thursday and Friday...don't forget that GP entries, results, press notes, stakes nominations and all things Gulfstream Park are available 24-7 at gulfstreampark.com.

Grade 1 Action: The second of three Championship Meet Grade 1s (Pegasus World Cup and Xpressbet.com Florida Derby) goes Saturday in race 9, the Gulfstream Park Turf Handicap. It is an excellent and diverse cast, led by two sons of Lookin At Lucky for trainer Chad Brown. I prefer the venerable **Money Multiplier** a little more than his Chilean-bred stablemate **Kurilov**. Money Multiplier has been so good for so long and has had a remarkable career from nine-to-12 furlongs. He's also plied his trade quietly and with little headline-grabbing flare; this is an unheralded veteran. I respect Money Multiplier because he goes out, runs hard and does his thing for a top-class operation teeming with star-studded talent. I also like the Todd Pletcher-trained **Hi Happy**, the Argentinian-bred son of Pure Prize who goes from a 6% Southern California trainer to Gulfstream Park's perennial leader in victories. I think the 6yo Hi Happy will show up with his best stateside effort yet (he's got four U.S. races, the last in early April of '17.) **Heart to Heart** likes this turf course, distance and had little chance last out in the Fort Laudy due to an awful start. He's as game as they come.

400k Guaranteed Late P5: Don't forget about Saturday's mega-money (cha-ching) guarantees at GP (mentioned in detail above for your reading pleasure.) No surprise here, but count me in as a fan of this late Pick 5, which is comprised by two awesome-looking GP graded turf stakes and overflowing, competitive fields. Here is a budget-minded Pick 5 play that totals \$18 for 50 cents. It might be wise to get a friend or two and pool your money because this is one *tough* sequence! Best of luck!

R8: 1,10 -Fresh Gargan claim from the rail and a sizable dropdown for TAP to start
R9: 1,4,5 -Wickedly evenly-matched field in the second of three Grade 1s this meet at GP
R10: 5,8,9 -Prefer the outside mares the most – classy – but feel Dream Dancing will run huge
R11: 10 -One more chance for the talented turfer Power of Attorney off that crazy Kitten's Joy
R12: 6,8 -Worried I'm a little light in coverage to cash but 'Pistol's' last win beats these again
