Saturday Stakes, Maidens & More

It looks like there is something for everyone this Saturday afternoon at Gulfstream Park. Yep, a diverse looking card awaits racing aficionados and horseplayers; the action begins a little after 12:45 ET. Fans of bulky-sized stakes fields will get just that in the day's featured \$75,000 Added Elegance, which was carded as the 11th race. The Added Elegance, restricted to fillies and mares, is near capacity with its 11-horse cast led by Razorback Lady, Ms Meshak and Royal Asscher. I'm taking Royal Asscher, who has been unbelievably sharp and consistently good off a February claim for trainer Gustavo Delgado. In fact, Royal Asscher gets a touch of class relief in this spot as she exits the Grade 2 Princess Rooney behind the Breeders' Cup-bound Stormy Embrace. Earlier in the day, fans are likely to find a tough-to-beat favorite in the form of Genghis, who is one of 11 juveniles entered in the 9th race, a Florida-bred maiden special weight for two-year-olds. Genghis has unfortunately faced two of the best South Florida-based juvenile colts up to this point in the unbeaten Positively Awesome and, most recently, the 92 Beyer-pulling Chance It. Chance It, by the way, looks like he's going to be an overwhelming favorite next Saturday – August 3rd – in the opening Dr. Fager Division of the Florida Sire Stakes. Genghis goes from stall 9 beneath jockey Emisael Jaramillo. Trainer Mark Casse entered first-time starter Finalist, a Tonalist colt who is related to seven winners.
