Race 8 looks like one of the best of Sunday's offerings at Gulfstream Park with its cast of 11 three-year-old fillies. Hard to believe but this ongoing winter meet (which began back on December 1st) has just five cards remaining including Sunday's 12 races. Race 8, meanwhile, has a good mix of the familiar and the unknown. Lady Munnings leads in the familiarity department and appears the filly-to-beat (if in a tight photo finish) for Hall of Fame trainer Jonathan Sheppard. She ran fine last out against a winning favorite in Trenchtown Cat and exits a February 17th maiden special that has produced one next-out winner on turf (a 20k maiden claimer.)

Bohemian Bourbon – This Ian Wilkes-trained Midshipman filly exits a very deep field here last month, her turf debut. Ebullient, who finished sixth that day, has since returned to win. Bohemian Bourbon cuts back to five furlongs beneath Julien Leparoux. I believe Bohemian Bourbon comes out of the best GP maiden race.

Blahnik – Ran twice at Saratoga last summer and disappointed in both of her short-priced starts. She'll turf sprint for the first time here Sunday for trainer Todd Pletcher and is a half-sister to a Sea the Stars colt who won an overseas turf race.

New Rules – Improved in her second start over dirt and will make her turf debut for trainer Norm Casse as a daughter of Justin Phillip. This one's dam went one for 17 over turf and New Rules is related to a half-sister who proved a minor turf winner.
